# **Tuberculosis (TB)**

## WHAT AND WHEN TO REPORT

\* \* Please do not wait for lab results to confirm a diagnosis of active TB prior to reporting \* \*

## 1) ACTIVE TB, SUSPECT

 A person for whom a health care provider suspects, after evaluating signs, symptoms, and/or, laboratory/radiographic evidence, is likely to have TB in any body site.

WHEN: Within 1 working day

HOW: By phone or faxing a TB Confidential Morbidity Report (CMR)

# 2) ACTIVE TB, CONFIRMED

 A person who has had a specimen that has a final result of Mycobacterium tuberculosis (M.tb) or M.tb complex (by culture or nucleic acid amplification test, NAAT)

WHEN: Within 1 working day HOW: By phone or faxing a CMR

# 3) CHILDREN UNDER 5 YEARS OF AGE WITH A DOCUMENTED POSITIVE TB SCREENING TEST

- Either a positive TB skin test (TST) or a TB blood test (interferon gamma release assay -- IGRA)
- See the Screening Tools section for a definition of a positive TB skin test.

WHEN: Within 1 week

HOW: By phone or faxing a CMR
